Research the PI's area of study and previous trials in advance.



Understand the purpose and significance of clinical research.



Convey enthusiasm about the position you are applying for.



Demonstrate interest in medicine and research.



Discuss past research experiences.



TIPS FOR NEW COORDINATORS



Although serving as a coordinator is rewarding, it can be challenging at times. Remember that there is a learning curve!

Always be willing to adapt and learn. Coordinators that are flexible and take correction with kindness are the most successful!

Stay organized! Keep all required and completed study documents in one place.

Maintain open communication with members of the research team and study participants.



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
